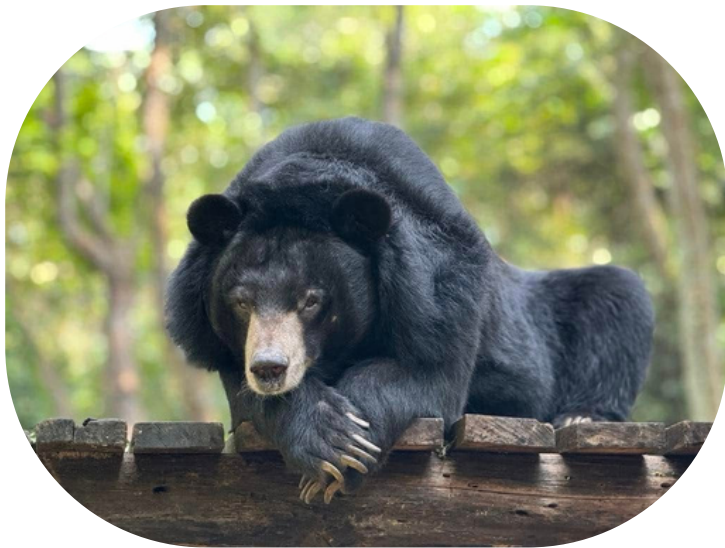


A GLOBAL REACH

Wilder International has supported projects in the UK, Asia, Africa, Central America and Australia with both practical and theoretical support. We have provided hands on field assistance, vital equipment, advice and training as well as increasing awareness and fundraising potential for these wildlife welfare and conservation organisations.



OUR PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS



Animals Asia

Wilder International have been supporting Animals Asia with bear and elephant welfare by helping to develop 24/7 welfare plans and providing camera traps for behavioural monitoring.

Sutton Bonington, UK

We have collaborated with both the Sutton Bonington Climate Crisis and Biodiversity Action community group and the University of Nottingham to support the management of three sites in the East Midlands. As part of this work we have carried out wildlife surveys, supported with hands on land management such as hedge laying and coppicing and held three volunteer sessions to remove over 3000 tree guards.

We have also collaborated with the Canal and River Trust to improve wetland and river management and the Nottinghamshire Wildlife Trust to aid water vole recovery.



Congo Biotropical Institute

Wilder International have been supporting the community led team by providing wildlife monitoring equipment and other resources to enable them to monitor gorillas, chimpanzees and other key species in the Democratic Republic of Congo.

CAMERA TRAP MONITORING PROGRAM

One of our first major partnerships was with the wildlife tech company NatureSpy. This incredible collaboration has enabled us to support many conservation and wildlife care organisations, as well as running our own projects, utilising 16 camera traps at 6 different sites in three countries to monitor behaviour in sanctuary animals to improve welfare, observe the health status of released individuals and monitor wild populations for conservation.



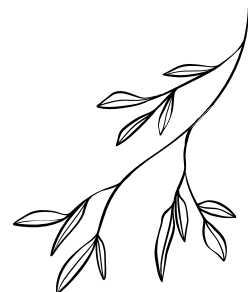
APE NUTRITION PROJECT



In early 2025 we began to create species specific ape nutrition courses to bridge a much needed gap in nutrition training for rescue center and sanctuary veterinarians and wildlife carers..

These online nutrition courses will provide carers with information on all aspects of feeding for gorillas, chimpanzees, orangutans and gibbons, which will be available freely to sanctuary staff.

These courses will not only provide valuable learning opportunities for individuals and build capacity for the organisations but will also improve the welfare of rescued apes throughout Africa and Asia. These courses were kindly funded by the Qato Foundation



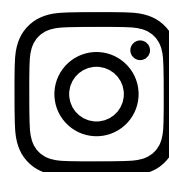
COMMUNICATION

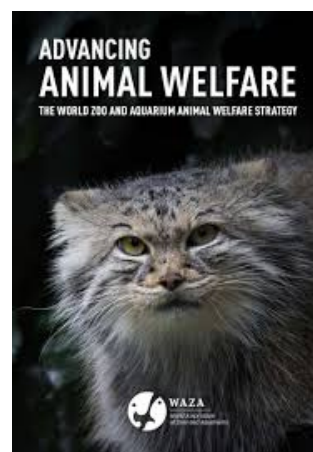

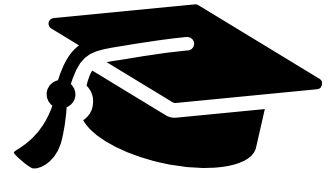

Publications

In our first year Wilder International has supported wildlife welfare and conservation organisations with raising awareness and fundraising potential, contributed to scientific papers and welfare documentation and published children's conservation literature to educate and inspire the next generation of wildlife welfare and conservation professionals.



EDUCATION



Presentations and Workshops

Throughout 2025 Wilder International have delivered 4 educational presentations at welfare conferences, veterinary facilities and smaller groups to teach, educate and inspire the next generation of veterinarians and conservation professionals. These talks also enable us to build further support for our conservation partners and showcase the work we do to support wildlife, people and places. Director Matyas presented his research into Vitamin D deficiency in great apes and the benefits of hand injection training in great apes for medical procedures and the implications this has on their welfare.



We also took part in a technology in wildlife welfare workshop in collaboration with the University of Nottingham and were thrilled to have been invited to present on our work supporting chimpanzee welfare at the first species specific chimpanzee workshop in Valencia.



Awareness

A big part of our mission at Wilder International is training and education, but not only for veterinarians, wildlife carers and conservationists! We are also incredibly passionate about educating the general public to improve their knowledge of wildlife welfare and conservation, educating them on what incredible wildlife can be found on their doorsteps and providing opportunities to become actively involved in native species conservation and rewilding.

In 2025 we launched our Camera Trap Tuesday segment on social media to educate the public on the native species found in the East Midlands by utilising footage from our camera trap monitoring program.

In the latter part of the year we also created our first 'Wilder Sutton Bonington' calendar to educate and inform the local community about native species found in the area. This also provided us with an additional fundraising opportunity and improved awareness and support for the conservation work we undertake in this region.

Throughout our first year Wilder International have forged incredible collaborations with like minded organisations to achieve our aims, created mutually beneficial partnerships and received both in kind and financial support from companies, trusts and charities.

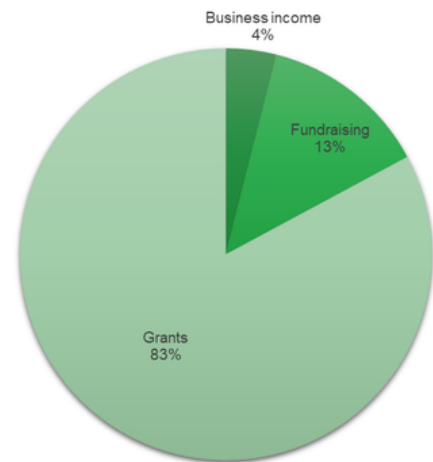

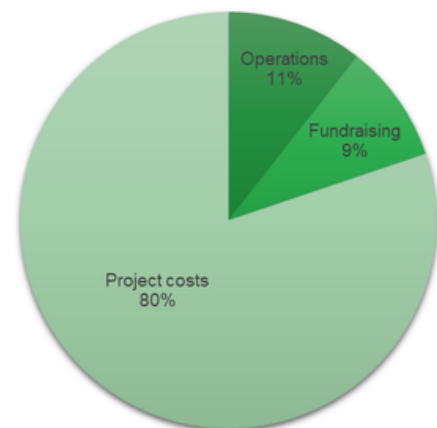
% Income Sources



Expenditure

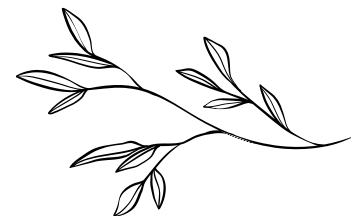
Operations	-£636.24
